Season Overview	<ul> <li>The 2024/25 season saw continued growth in club participation.</li> <li>Total registered players increased from approx. 380 in 2023/24 to just over 440 this season.</li> <li>Notable expansion in the Minis &amp; Youth (M&amp;Y) section.</li> <li>The club experienced significant growth in travel, with 23 separate teams traveling overseas throughout the season (up from 12 trips the previous season).</li> </ul>
Financial Audit	<ul> <li>Increased travel resulted in higher overall expenses.</li> <li>Staff costs were reduced this year following the end of sponsorship support for First Aid Qatar.</li> <li>The club recorded a loss of QAR 12,000 for the 2024/25 season.</li> <li>This loss is largely attributed to travel expenditure.</li> <li>However, across the past four seasons, DRFC has maintained an average annual profit of QAR 115,000, demonstrating overall financial health.</li> </ul>
Facility Update	<ul> <li>DRFC has entered the tender for the Doha Sports Park (DSP) lease.</li> <li>There are five companies in total in the tender process.</li> <li>The tender closed on May 29, but results are not expected until after Eid.</li> </ul>

A RUGBY	<ul> <li>In parallel, the club is still pursuing the possibility of building a dedicated facility.</li> <li>The most recent update from the ministry indicated the proposal is "currently under review" (April 21st 2025).</li> <li>Since April 21, this has been escalated to the sponsor for follow-up.</li> </ul>
Celebrating 40 years	DRFC had <b>17 sponsors</b> last season, contributing a total of <b>QAR 300,000</b> , primarily allocated to travel support.
	The goal for the 2025/26 season is to match or exceed this figure.
	Sponsorship revenue will directly benefit team sections, and all teams are encouraged to seek out new sponsor leads.
Sponsorship	Tim is available to meet with any potential sponsors.
	The <b>DRFC Golf Day</b> was highlighted as a major success and is planned to become an <b>annual event</b> to increase sponsor engagement.
	Four nominations were received.
ExCom	No nominee opted to proceed, so these roles remain with Tim Newnham as Chairman and Pip Innes as Club Captain.
	Q: Are we staying at DSP?
	The club is waiting on the outcome of the tender process.
	DSP continues to serve as a suitable venue, but if another bidder wins and costs increase, the situation will be reviewed accordingly.
	Q: Will DRFC go into schools next year?
A.O.B	A new Rugby Development Officer (RDO) has been approached and offered a role that includes outreach into schools.

	Currently only <b>Doha College</b> term dates have been confirmed; the club's calendar is provisionally based on this.
	Q: Development and girls' queries:
	DRFC plans to run <b>two tournaments</b> in the upcoming season to increase participation (M&Y).
	A girls-only introduction to rugby session is being considered.



- There are ongoing discussions around **encouraging more female coaches** in the M&Y section to serve as role models.
  - Senior team players (men & women) will be encouraged to attend Saturday training sessions at least once a month to encourage young people to continue playing.

## **Retention Concerns – Girls' Rugby:**

- Concern raised over girls dropping off between U10 and U13, particularly with the current mixed-gender format in U11/U12.
  - o DRFC will explore the possibility of **separate girls' tournaments** and contact UAE clubs for potential collaboration.
